

We, the undersigned, residents of the State of Florida,

being twenty one (21) years or more of age, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation (not for profits) under the statutes of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE ONE

NAME

The name of the corporation shall be Hispanic Unity of Florida, Inc.

ARTICLE T

LOCATION

The location of the principal office of Hispanic Unity of Florida, Inc. shall be 1341 S.W. 6 Terrace, city of Deerfield Beach, County of Broward, State of Florida.

ARTICLE THREE

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Hispanic Unity of Florida shall be as follows:

- To provide help and guidance to the hispanic residents of the State of Florida and their families in order for these to adjust better to the american culture in general and that of the State of Florida in specific.
- To promote, develop and conduct human service programs in accordance with the need of the community.
- To act as liaison between the Hispanic Community of the State of Florida and government and private human service agencies.

HUF hosts first-ever convention with a \$4,000 grant from IBM. The event raises awareness of Hispanic issues and cements the agency's importance to the community.

1993

1994

Partnership with Broward County School Board launched. By 2012 1,000-1,500 students learn English (ESOL) at Hispanic Unity every year.

HUF receives its first major gift of \$10,000 each from Jim and Jan Moran and JM Family Enterprises, Inc., as a challenge match. Thanks to Maria Sanjuan, HUF received the match.

1999

REACH 2010 launches to combat HIV/AIDS. HUF's first research study led by CDC-funded Florida International University in partnership with MDEI, the Urban League of Broward County, American Red Cross, Broward County Health Department, Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance (Broward Alliance) and Broward County.


Growth of ESOL drives expansion. HUF purchases second building near administrative office.




